




ST5 – Needs & Readiness Assessment

- ST5 Need and Readiness: Number of sites with identified need and/readiness for improving access or creating appeal for nutrition and physical activity supports.
- "A consistent process for needs assessments or environmental scans is one that is documented and can be <u>replicated</u> across jurisdictions and over time."
- Qualifying assessments can include:
 - Structured environmental assessments (i.e. WellSAT, PAC, Stock Healthy Shop Healthy, Farm to School Assessment etc.)
 - Qualitative Assessment using a structured/semi-structured replicable methodology

ST5: Qualitative Assessment


- Please specify assessment tool used:
 - Interviews
 - Focus Group
 - Community Conversations
 - Structured Observation (e.g. use of a systematic process for observing and recording observations)
- Good resource: CommunityToolBox.org (Chapter 3 Qualitative Methods to Assess Community Issues)



- Did you use a qualitative data collection method in conducting the assessment?
 - If yes, describe how the qualitative data was collected
- Be sure to describe:
 - Nature of the questions what did you hope to learn?
 - # of participants
 - Information about who the participants are (i.e. community members, business owners, school administrators, etc.)

• Example:

"We conducted 2 focus groups and a total of 18 participants attended (8 participants in group 1 and 10 in group 2). Focus group 1 was with seniors and the 2nd group was with young adults. Focus group questions were developed to learn more about participants' needs for fresh fruits and vegetables in the South East neighborhood."

MT5 & MT6 Adoption

- <u>Environmental Change</u>: Includes the **built or physical** environments, which are visible or observable and may include economic, social, normative, or message environments.
- <u>Systems Change</u>: Ongoing organizational decisions or changes that result in new activities reaching large proportions of people the organization serves; alters how business is done
- <u>Policy Change</u>: A written statement of an organizational position, decision, or course of action. They are adopted by a body that has the authority to adopt them. Policies describe actions, resources, implementation, evaluation, and enforcement.
- <u>Promotion</u>: Marketing efforts to promote PSE changes

MT5 & MT6: Other Considerations

- ✓ PSE Changes are new
- PSE Changes are ongoing
- X The following are <u>not</u> PSE adoption:
 - Promotion of existing resources in the community
 - Provision of educational materials at community sites if it is not ongoing
 - Establishment of a "Wellness Team" or other collaboration working on PSE changes


Documenting Need without an ST5 Assessment

Documenting Need without an ST5 Assessment

- Examples:
 - Building off previous assessments conducted outside of SNAP-Ed
 - Knowledge acquired though through lived experiences and working with staff



MT5 & MT6 Partnerships

- Most PSE change adoptions will involve at least 1 organizational partnership (ST7). This often includes the site where the PSE change occurred.
- When you report that an adoption is complete, don't forget to include all contributing partners.






ST6 Champions

- Community change agents who have engaged in efforts outside of SNAP-Ed programming to improve access or create appeal for nutrition and physical activity supports
- Reporting is only done when there are examples of champions who have achieved significant results during the period assessed




ST6 Champions Tips

- New in FY20: Activities and accomplishments reporting
- Tips:
 - Justify numbers with descriptions of champion contributions
 - Pertains only to PSE, not Direct Education

ST7 Organizational Partnerships

- Includes partnerships with service providers, organizational leaders, and SNAP-Ed representatives where people eat, learn, live, play, shop, and work
- Partnerships are involved in needs assessment and in implementing PSE change strategies
- This partnership is at the site-level except:
 - Collaborations with less than 5 sectors should be included here

ST8 Multi-Sector Coalitions

 Includes coalitions or partnerships with at least 5 diverse sector representatives who reach lowincome audiences through their services that address nutrition and physical activity-related community changes
